

On bare feet. Clothing from the prehistoric era to the modern age through production and representation

How did they dress in ancient times? Which tools did they use to create said clothing? How did fashion change? These questions and much more will be answered at the exhibition presented by the Sardinian Museums Organization on Wednesday, June 6th, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. in the conference hall at the National Archeological and Ethnographic Museum “Giovanni Antonio Sanna” of Sassari, via Roma 64, with the presentation of *On bare feet. Clothing from the prehistoric era to the modern age through production and representation*. An original story that helps us discover the tools and fabrics used for clothing over the centuries that passed from the prehistoric era to the modern age.

Archeological digs helped in obtaining countless items that detail the daily life and habits of ancient populations. These findings, with their decorations and representations on ceramic vases or statues, show us how things were used, allowing the visitor to observe such change in fashion and taste, in use and in style, over the years. Some panels will actually send the visitor on a path dedicated to the description of objects found in digs, accompanied by garment production information as well as the use of objects relating to clothing, such as loom weights, spindles, pins and buckles.
