Wine and its origins. A pastime for bored merchants, a pillar of the Roman economy, trade for purchasing slaves, proof of transgressions for bolder matrons, a precious drink that takes center stage. In order to learn the history and social value, the Sardinian Museums Organization, in collaboration with the town of Porto Torres and Azienda Vitivinicola 1 Sorso di Leonardo Bagella, on Wednesday, September 6th, 2017 at 6:30 p.m., with the extended opening until 10:00 p.m., is organizing at the National Archeological Museum Antiquarium Turritano and the archeological area of Turris Libisonis in Porto Torres, the conference “*Vialia Turritana*”.

The rich program for the evening has in store, starting at 7 p.m., the reenactment as put on by the Associazione Sardinia Romana - Anticae Viae, which offers up moments of workmanship, trade and consumption in the classic age of wine, between the printing press, amphora, dolia and pottery as brought to light by the Mediterranean regions. Following this, eno-gastronomic journalist Pasquale Porcu will join the fun with his contribution of Sardinian wine production, as well as the origins and original traditions that belong to contemporary society.

At 9 p.m., Carlo Tronchetti, the director of the National Archeological Museum of Cagliari, will present the conference “*Oinos, vinum, vino*”. The scholar, through literary sources and findings from Greek, Etruscan and Roman river banks in the Mediterranean, bring us to the heart of the archeological discoveries that rewrote history.

At 6:30 p.m., at sunset, the staff of the Antiquarium Turritano will accompany visitors on a themed route into the archeological area of Turris Libisonis.
