

**Presentation of literary work “Hospiton” by Vindice Lecis**  
**National Archeological and Ethnographic Museum “Giovanni Antonio Sanna” of Sassari**  
**Friday, May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017, at 5:30 p.m.**

Experiencing the museum in all that it has to offer with captivating and diversified culture. On Friday, May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at 5:30 p.m. in the conference hall at the National Archeological and Ethnographic Museum “Giovanni Antonio Sanna” of Sassari, via Roma 64, art historian Marisa Porcu Gaias presents Vindice Lecis’s book *Hospiton*.

The work is set in Sardinia at the end of the sixth century under Constantinople’s Roman rule and details the evangelization of the Barbagia people, who were at the moment the most pagan people of the west. Within this piece is also the story of Hospito, chief of the Barbagia people. The initiative, organized in collaboration with bookstore Koinè in Sassari, offers its cultural and communicative role in the museum and opens a crucial window for authors that create stories and loyal reconstructions of their narrations. For this reason, among others, the public will be involved in new cultural happenings that will certainly raise their attention regarding museum collections as they will be surrounded by them during the presentation itself.
