

**Book presentation “A Drink at the Nuraghe” by Ercole Contu**  
**Archeological and Ethnographic Museum “G. A. Sanna” of Sassari**

**Wine culture in Sardinia and the almost sacred production involved.** Wine practice was traced down to the representations found on ceramic pieces and famous bronze artifacts, providing for an original finding. On Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at 7:00 p.m., in the conference hall at the National Archeological and Ethnographic Museum “Giovanni Antonio Sanna” of Sassari, via Roma 64, Pasquale Porcu, journalist at La Nuova Sardegna, presents the literary work by Ercole Contu, ***A Drink at the Nuraghe.***

The archeologist explores the ancient roots in Sardinian wine culture and goes into detail regarding the production process as well as its importance dating back to ancient times. The author retraces wine production to the confines of the island, finding roots in exporting materials to many Mediterranean regions all the way back to Troy, a finding that showed Sardinia led the way in a wide variety of wine. The book manages to tie together information from ancient Egypt all the way to Roman times, from Nuraghe Sardinia all the way to the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
